Foreword

Dear JACET members and supporters,

It is with great honor and excitement that I assume the position of the 8th President of The Japan Association of College English Teachers (JACET).

In 1962, JACET was established in a time of educational reform in order to improve the state of English language education. Those involved were strongly convinced of the need to solve college-level problems related to English

language education so as to improve its teaching at all levels of the education system.

Six types of JACET activities are stipulated in Article 5 of the JACET Statutes (Teikan). Each activity is described in terms of its objectives, target, scale, publicity and expected results as follows:

First Activity: Holding a national convention, seminars and other meetings for the presentation of theories of university education and language education as well as reports on practice results

Second Activity: Publication of journals, bulletins, news and project reports

Third Activity: Awarding JACET prizes to scholars associated with university education, academic associations and institutions

Fourth Activity: Research and study of theories and practices of university English education and related language education

Fifth Activity: Exchange of scholars with affiliate associations

Sixth Activity: Other activities necessary to accomplish the objectives of this association

JACET consists of the Headquarters and seven chapters: Hokkaido, Tohoku, Kanto, Chubu, Kansai, Chugoku-Shikoku and Kyushu-Okinawa. The Board of Directors (*Rijikai*) includes one president, two vice-presidents, seven chapter presidents, seven chapter-appointed directors, three president-appointed directors and two auditors. JACET is now officially affiliated with ten associations and institutions: AILA, RELC (Singapore), KATE (South Korea), ETA-ROC (Taiwan), ALAK (South Korea), MELTA (Malaysia), PKETA (South Korea), CELEA (China), Thailand TESOL (Thailand) and JALT (Japan).

It is my great honor and privilege to introduce the Applied Linguistics Association of Korea

(ALAK) and its conferences to the members of JACET, a long-time affiliate of ALAK. Through this opportunity, I hope we can build a more active and stronger partnership between our two associations in the future.

Established in 1978, ALAK has grown to become one of the most proactive and progressive organizations for researchers and practitioners in Applied Linguistics in Korea. It has about 1,500 members and six international affiliates including AILA, JACET, CELEA in China, TEFLIN in Indonesia, Thai TESOL in Thailand, and FEELTA in Russia. ALAK hosts a Research Methodology Workshop every spring and an annual international conference each fall. This year's conference is very special as it is hosted by ALAK in association with JACET, CELEA, and GETA, a Korean English language teaching association. ALAK is hoping to host the AILA World Congress in 2023.

The 2015 ALAK International Conference was held at Chung-Ang University, Seoul, Korea, on Sept. 19, 2015, under the theme "Sustainability in Applied Linguistics". The three plenary speakers were Dr. Claire Kramsch (Univ. of Berkeley, USA), Dr. Kilryoung Lee (Hankuk Univ. of Foreign Studies, Korea), and Dr. Farzad Sharifian (Monash Univ., Australia) who demonstrated such great professional standards. We had three featured speakers from our Asian partner organizations, Dr. Hisashi Naito (JACET), Ibu Dra. Diah Kristina (TEFLIN), and Dr. Tatyana Lupacheva (FEELTA). These speakers represented the high quality of Asian scholarship along with our two Korean featured speakers, Dr. Hyejoo Lee (President, The Society of Sustainability Science) and Dr. Sung

Hee Choi (Gyeonggi College of Science and Technology).

The conference was truly international as it featured presentations from approximately 130 speakers from 15 countries in diverse formats—including plenary and featured talks, paper and poster presentations, and the CALL Fair. All inspired and enlightened our approximately 350 conference participants.



The 3rd AILA East-Asia and 2016 ALAK-GETA Joint International Conference will be held at Honam University, Gwangju, Korea, Sept. 9-11, 2016. The conference theme is "ELT and Applied Linguistics in a Globalizing Asia: Opportunities and Challenges". This year's conference is expected to provide the participants with the richest and the most exciting program ever in terms of its invited speakers, educational and cultural programs, and the natural and human beauty that you can experience only in Gwangju - a city of arts and culture. Our plenary speakers are Dr. Daniel Perrin (Zurich University of Applied Sciences, Vice President of AILA), Dr. Gabriele Kasper (University of Hawaii at Manoa), and Dr.

Hyukseung Kwon (Seoul National University, Former President of ALAK). Five featured speakers from five overseas partners will join the invited sessions.

The three-day event consists of an English classroom visit, invited workshops and the AILA East-Asia Symposium on the first day (Sept. 9), a full day of paper and poster presentations on the second day (Sept. 10), and a cultural tour program on the third day (Sept. 11).

I hope to be able to host as many JACET friends and colleagues as possible at Honam University where I am teaching and to return the warm welcome and hospitality that I was shown in Kagoshima last year.
