1. Research areas

Convention Theme, CLIL, Corpus, Curriculum (Pedagogy), ESP/EAP, Grammar (Syntax), ICT/CALL, Language Policy (ELF, WE), Learner Development (Motivation, Strategies, Autonomy, Learner Beliefs), Linguistics, Listening, Psycholinguistics, Reading, SLA (Child Language Acquisition, Bilingualism, Immersion, Interlanguage), Sociolinguistics (Pragmatics), Speaking (Phonetics, Phonology, Pronunciation, Conversation Analysis), Teacher Education, Testing and Assessment, Vocabulary (Lexicography), Writing, other areas related to language teaching and learning

2. Submission requirements

2.1 Presentation types

- (1) Research paper on the convention theme, ELT or related disciplines: 25 min. including 5 min. for Q&A.
- (2) Case study / action research on classroom activities or ELT curriculum innovation: 25 min. including 5 min. for Q&A.
- (3) Symposium: Presentation by each presenter that is followed by discussion: 90 min.
- (4) Workshop: Presenters engage participants in various tasks: 90 min.
- (5) Poster session: Posters should be A0 (vertical) in size.Presenters must be available during the designated poster session period.
- (6) Associate member's presentation: 25 min. including 5 min. for Q&A. This type of presentation should focus on teaching materials for college English education, and *should be presented primarily by the author, editor, or supervising editor*.

2.2 Student member special presentations

(1) This is a special category of presentation for members who are registered <u>as student members</u> as of the day when the proposal is submitted. All presenters in this category will be candidates for "JACET Award: The excellent

presentation as a young scholar." The winner will be presented with the award during the convention.

- (2) Presentations should be a research paper or a case study, and must be presented in English. Please prepare 30 copies of your handouts.
- (3) Group presentations are not accepted.
- (4) Successful applicants will be granted free entry to the convention and free admission to the convention party.
- (5) Student members can apply for other types of presentations listed in 2.1 above, but cannot apply for both categories.

2.3 Honorary President's Award (Poster session: Regular member presentation)

The Honorary President's Award is given for a presentation in the regular member poster session. All posters are considered for the award. If you do not wish your poster to be considered for the award, you can indicate this when submitting for the convention.

2.4 Eligibility

- (1) To be eligible to present, the presenter (or in a group presentation, the first presenter) must be either a. or b. below:
 - a. A JACET member who has paid the fiscal year 2020 (April 1st, 2020 March 31st, 2021) membership fee. <u>If the</u> <u>JACET office has not received the membership payment, the presentation will be canceled</u>. If the first author is not a JACET member, he or she must become a member prior to the presentation. To apply for membership, go to http://www.jacet.org/about_jacet/how_to_join_jacet/.

Note: For group presentations, other presenters do not need to be JACET members.

b. A member of an overseas JACET affiliate (ALAK, CELEA, ETA-ROC, KATE, MELTA, PKETA, SEAMEO RELC, and Thai TESOL), or a member of AILA affiliates (https://aila.info/about/organization/ aila_affiliates/). Colleagues overseas who are not members of the affiliated organizations need to become JACET members in order to be eligible for the presentation.

Note: For group presentations, all other presenters must be either members of an overseas JACET affiliate, AILA affiliates, or JACET members. Those who are not must have completed the membership payment prior to the presentation.

- (2) <u>Only one</u> abstract submission per person (including associate members) is permitted.
- (3) Papers should not have been previously published or presented.
- (4) Papers should be presented at the convention by their authors. <u>All authors must be present</u> at the time of their presentation. In case of emergency, notify the JACET office.
- (5) Presenting in English is highly encouraged.
- (6) All types of presentations should, as a basic rule, have no more than 5 presenters.

2.5 Application Procedure –All applications must be completed online.

- Presentation Abstract: 300 words maximum for presentations in English, 800 characters maximum for presentations in Japanese.
 - *Research paper, Poster session*: Include aim, hypothesis, method, <u>results</u>, and conclusion. The results are essential.
 - *Case study*: Describe the research context by including student profiles, number of students, class objectives, lesson procedures, etc.
 - Symposium, Workshop: Include aim, content, etc.
 - Associate member's presentation: Include aim, hypothesis, method, conclusion, etc. For case study, student profiles, number of students, class objectives, lesson procedures, etc. should be outlined.
 - Note: Your abstract will appear in *The 59th JACET International Convention (Kyoto, 2020) Book.* Do not include charts, graphs, special characters or references in your abstract. Please see the guidelines and sample on our

website.

- (2) Biographical Data: <u>50 words maximum in English</u> for all presenters.
 - Note: Biographical data will appear in *The 59th JACET International Convention (Kyoto, 2020) Book* and will not be used for any other purposes. Please see the sample on our website.

Important: Once your proposal has been accepted for presentation, your submitted abstract and biographical data will be printed in the convention book in its submitted form. Changes will not be permitted, so please carefully check your proposal before submission.

- (3) Requesting Equipment:
 - 1. When you apply online, check the boxes for the equipment you need.
 - 2. Changes of request for equipment cannot be accepted, so please choose carefully.
 - 3. Computer Users
 - Bring your own computer.
 - If you need audio output, bring your own audio cable.
 - A projector and cables for connecting the computer to the projector will be available on site.
 - As a general rule, Internet connections will not be available.
- (4) Online Application Steps:
 - 1. On the JACET website (http://www.jacet.org/), proceed to the Call for Papers of Convention 2020 website and click on Proposal Submission.
 - 2. Fill in all required items on the application form. For a group presentation, the first presenter should complete the application.
 - 3. Click **Submit** only one time.
 - 4. Print the [Confirmation of Submission Email] that will be sent to the first presenter. Keep the copy as evidence that your application has been received.

2.6 Submission period

January 15th (Wed.) - February 6h (Thu.), 2020 (11:59:59 p.m. JST).

3. Selection of Presentations

After the final selection, the first presenter will be notified by email of the status of the proposal at the end of March 2020. In order to give the presentation, <u>registration fees for the 59th JACET International Convention (Kyoto, 2020) must be paid by May 29th, 2020.</u>

4. JACET International Convention Selected Papers

Presenters are encouraged to submit a paper for the Selected Papers (*JACET International Convention Selected Papers Vol. 8*) after the convention. Guidelines for submissions will be announced at a later date.
